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## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF SPORTS CHANGE LIFE FOUNDATION LIMITED (INCORPORATED IN HONG KONG WITH LIMITED BY GUARANTEE)**

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### **OPINION**

We have audited the financial statements of Sports Change Life Foundation Limited (the "Foundation") set out on pages 5 to 9, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 March 2020, and the income statement for the year ended 31 March 2020, and notes to financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the financial statements of the Foundation are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the Hong Kong Small and Medium-sized Entity Financial Reporting Standard ("SME-FRS") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") and have been properly prepared in compliance with the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance.

### **BASIS FOR OPINION**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Hong Kong Standards on Auditing ("HKSA") and with reference to Practice Note 900 (Revised), *Audit of Financial Statements Prepared in Accordance with the Small and Medium-sized Entity Financial Reporting Standard* issued by the HKICPA. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Foundation in accordance with the HKICPA's *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* ("the Code"), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### **OTHER INFORMATION**

The directors are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises all information included in the directors' report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF DIRECTORS AND THOSE CHARGED WITH GOVERNANCE FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

The directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the SME-FRS issued by the HKICPA and the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance, and for such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the directors are responsible for assessing the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the directors either intend to liquidate the Foundation or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Foundation's financial reporting process.

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### **AUDITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE AUDIT OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

Our report will be made solely to you, as a body in accordance with the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (Cap. 622), and for no other purpose. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Foundation to cease to continue as a going concern.

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**REPORTING ENTITY**

Sports Change Life Foundation Limited (the "Foundation") is a foundation incorporated in Hong Kong with limited by guarantee. The Foundation's registered office is located at Room 179, 4/F Venus Industrial Building, 45 - 51 Tai Lin Pai Road, Kwai Chung, New Territories. The principal activity of the Foundation was helping the poor and low-income people to improve their living conditions, health and employment.

**1. BASIS OF PREPARATION**

The Foundation qualifies for the reporting exemption as a small private foundation under section 359(1)(a) of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (Cap.622) and is therefore entitled to prepare and present its financial statements in accordance with the Small and Medium-sized Entity Financial Reporting Standard (SME-FRS) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

At 31 March 2020, the Foundation had current liabilities and a deficit on fund of HK\$264,033. The members have confirmed their intention to provide sufficient financial support to the Foundation to enables the Foundation to meet its liabilities as and when they fall due and to enable the Foundation to continue operations in the foreseeable future. Consequently, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

These financial statements comply with the SME-FRS and have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting. The measurement base adopted is the historical cost convention.

**2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

(a) Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Foundation and when the revenue can be measured reliably, on the following basis:

- (i) donation received is recognised as revenue when the Foundation has the entitlement to the income;
- (ii) function income is recognised when the fundtion event has been held; and
- (iii) interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the interest applicable.

(b) Taxation

Income tax expense represents current tax expense. The income tax payable represents the amounts expected to be paid to the taxation authority, using the tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax is not provided.

**2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

(c) Related parties

For the purpose of these financial statements, related party includes a person and entity as defined below :

(a) A person or a close member of that person's family is related to the Foundation if that person :

- (i) has control or joint control over the Foundation; or
- (ii) has significant influence over the Foundation; or
- (iii) is a member of the key management personnel of the Foundation or of a parent of the Foundation.

(b) An entity is related to the Foundation if any of the following conditions applies :

- (i) The entity and the Foundation are members of the same group (which means that each parent, subsidiary and fellow subsidiary is related to the others).
- (ii) One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member).
- (iii) Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party.
- (iv) One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity.
- (v) The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the reporting entity or an entity related to the Foundation.
- (vi) The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in (a).
- (vii) A person identified in (a)(i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity).
